Contact either Chip Smith or Steve Freudenthal if you need additional BBQ tickets before the next scout meeting.

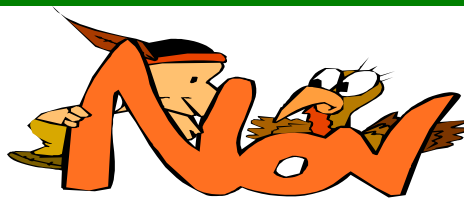
